#### TO THE

#### CONSTITUTION

## ARTICLE XIII. AMENDMENTS (Page 106)

Amendments to the Constitution may be made at any regularly called session of the General Council provided that the proposed amendments have been submitted in writing at least 6 months in advance to the Executive Presbytery. Before the Executive Presbytery may submit proposed amendments for consideration by a session of the General Council, it shall provide written notice of the proposed amendments by regular or electronic mail to the office of each district superintendent and each district secretary and to ministers of The General Council of the Assemblies of God, not later than 30 days prior to said session. Amendments to the Constitution shall require a two-thirds vote of all members present and voting.

#### DISTRICT COUNCIL NOMENCLATURE

1	WHEREAS,	The Assemblies of God membership consists of all ministers in possession of
2		current credential recognition by the Assemblies of God and all churches who
3		have voluntarily chosen affiliation with the Assemblies of God; and
4	WHEREAS,	The district councils (both geographic and language/ethnic) recognized by the
5		Assemblies of God serve as the primary interface for credential matters and
6		providing a network of fellowship among member churches and ministers; and
7	WHEREAS,	In order to more clearly convey culture, mission, and purpose, various district
8		councils have chosen to amend their identity, choosing other descriptive names;
9		and
10	WHEREAS,	The General Council documents should recognize and empower its districts in
11		such action; therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED,	That General Council Constitution ARTICLE X. DISTRICT COUNCILS,

15		constitution and bylaws.

1	Angels h	eralded Christ's birth with the words, "Peace on earth." We also know that, as the
2	Prince of Pea	ce, Christ will return soon to set up His kingdom by bringing "Peace on earth" and
3	rule with just	ice. However, between these two events, what is our role in bringing peace and
4	justice to our	world today? Do we merely wait for Christ to return and bring peace? Do calls for
5	justice in the	Old Testament speak to the Assemblies of God today? Is there a place for a
6	Pentecostal pr	rophetic word like that of Amos? What should be our response to conflict, human
7	trafficking, sl	ave labor, child exploitation, the homeless, and widows and orphans? The General
8	Council of th	e Assemblies of God, district councils, and local churches should be involved in
9	conflict resolu	ntion between churches, denominations, races, religions, and countries. We believe
10	justice and pe	eacemaking are necessary complements of compassion ministries, and this should
11	be clearly stat	ed in our Constitution.
12	Furtherm	ore, the Commission on Doctrinal Purity and the General Presbytery approved the
13	Assemblies of	of God position paper entitled, "Church Mission and Peacemaking." We, the
14	undersigned,	propose the following amendment to our Constitution, ARTICLE III.
15	PREROGATI	IVES, line e. which reads, "To respond to human need with ministries of
16	compassion,"	by adding the words "and actions that promote justice and peacemaking."

19	WHEREAS,	The General Council at its August 2009 meeting in Orlando, Florida, amended the

24		example; and

28	WHEREAS,	Zechariah wrote, "This is what the LORD Almighty said, 'Administer true justice;
29		show mercy and compassion to one another" (Zechariah 7:9); and

1	WHEREAS,	Paul wrote, "Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to
2		mutual edification" (Romans 14:19); and
3	WHEREAS,	The author of Hebrews wrote, "Make every effort to live in peace with everyone
4		and to be holy" (Hebrews 12:14); and
5	WHEREAS,	James wrote, "Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness"
6		(James 3:18); and
7	WHEREAS,	Matthew records the prophecy of Isaiah, "A bruised reed he will not break, and a
8		smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he has brought justice through to
9		victory" (Matthew 12:20; Isaiah 42:3); and
10	WHEREAS,	The Assemblies of God adopted the position paper entitled, "Church Mission and
11		Peacemaking," which states, "the Assemblies of God considers peacemaking to
12		be intrinsic to the Church's mission" (page 1, line 2); "the Church in our time, and
13		every time, has both the imperative and the challenge of pursuing peace" (page 4,
14		line 19); and "in view of the admonitions of Scripture to pursue peace in a broken
15		world, the importance and relevance of deliberate peacemaking activities is
16		abundantly clear" (page 9, line 23); and
17	WHEREAS,	Justice seeking and peacemaking are necessary complements to ministries of
18		compassion in regards to a Christian response to human need; therefore, be it
19	RESOLVED,	That the General Council Constitution, ARTICLE III. PREROGATIVES, line e,

#### QUALIFYING MEMBERSHIP IN LOCAL CHURCHES

1	WHEREAS,	The qualifying requirements for recognition of a local church being given General
2		Council affiliated status is established by the General Council Constitution
3		ARTICLE XI. LOCAL ASSEMBLIES; and
4	WHEREAS,	One of the minimal requirements established is the number of voting members in
5		the local assembly, currently established at 20 (twenty) members; and
6	WHEREAS,	The underlying assumption of the recognition of "General Council affiliated
7		status" for a local assembly is the achievement of both self-governance and self-
8		sustaining in its operations; and
9	WHEREAS,	It is for the benefit of healthy local churches that this threshold number be
10		reviewed by the General Council in session, for the purpose of providing
11		maximum strength to the local church; therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED,	That General Council Constitution ARTICLE XI. LOCAL ASSEMBLIES,
13		Section 1. General Council Affiliated Assemblies, paragraph a. Requirements for
14		affiliation, subparagraph (3), page 104, which currently reads:
15		(3) Have a minimum active voting membership of 20 persons who shall accept
16		responsibility to maintain scriptural order in the local body. In cases where
17		there are fewer than 20 voting members, an exception may be granted by the
18		district, in compliance with General Presbytery policy, and provided that the
19		church has demonstrated the capacity for self-governance;
20		Be amended to read:
21		(3) Have a minimum active voting membership of 30 20 persons who shall
22		accept responsibility to maintain scriptural order in the local body. In cases
23		where there are fewer than $30$ 20 voting members, an exception may be

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any regular meeting of The General Council of the Assemblies of God. Amendments to be adopted shall require a majority of all votes cast.

#### **INACTIVE MINISTERS STATUS**

1	WHEREAS,	The General Council Bylaws ARTICLE VII. MINISTRY, Section 6. Official List,
2		references an "inactive list" for those credential holders who have not been
3		engaged in viable ministry and proclamation of the gospel over a period of one
4		year; and
5	WHEREAS,	The categories of lapsed, resigned, not renewed, and dismissed have served well
6		to define any needed credential changes from that of an "active status"; and
7	WHEREAS,	The inactive list itself has not been maintained or updated by district councils and
8		the general secretary's office for many years, with the exception of ministers with
9		disabilities; and
10	WHEREAS,	An inactive list presently seems to serve no necessary purpose moving forward,
11		other than for those ministers with disabilities; therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED,	That General Council Bylaws ARTICLE VII. MINISTRY, Section 6. Official
13		List, paragraph b. Inactive or disabled ministers and paragraph c. Restoration to
14		active status, pages 131–132, which presently reads:

#### SENIOR STATUS FOR MINISTERS

1	WHEREAS,	General Council Bylaws ARTICLE VII. MINISTRY, Section 7. Senior Ministers,
2		mandates the reclassifying of each credential holder who turns 65 years of age as
3		either senior-active, senior-semiretired, or senior-retired; and
4	WHEREAS,	The age of 65 no longer represents retirement age for many credential holders;
5		and
6	WHEREAS,	Reasons related to insurances or other credential benefits that would be linked to
7		the age of 65 no longer exist; and
8	WHEREAS,	The senior-active and senior-semiretired statuses do not change a credential
9		holder's financial obligations to the General Council or to most districts; and
10	WHEREAS,	It requires extra time and expense for the General Council to track and notify
11		ministers of their senior status when they turn age 65, with no related changes,
12		benefits, or consequences for the credential holder; and
13	WHEREAS,	The re-designated status of "senior" has not always been understood in the
14		honorary way in which it was intended for credential holders who are still active
15		in ministry; therefore, be it
16	RESOLVED,	That General Council Bylaws ARTICLE VII. MINISTRY, Section 7. Senior
17		Ministers and paragraphs a. through c., pages 132–133, which presently reads:
18		Section 7. Senior Ministers
19		In respect and honor to those ministers who have given years of service to
20		the Fellowship, senior status shall automatically be given to all credential
21		holders who have reached the age of 65, whether or not they continue in full-
22		time ministry.
23		a. Terminology
24		(1) The term senior-active shall be used for credential holders
25		who continue to serve more than half-time in the ministry.
26		(2) The term senior-semiretired shall be used for credential
27		holders who continue to be active, but for half-time or less.
28		(3) The term <i>senior-retired</i> shall be used for those who have
29		ceased to engage in any regular appointed ministry.

**b.** Application for retired category. Senior-semiretired and senior-retired status shall be granted only to those ministers who filed a request for such status with their district office. The district secretary shall forward annually to the general secretary a list of those ministers who have made these requests.

#### c. Guidelines

- (1) *Reports*. Senior-active and senior-semiretired ministers shall continue to file their annual reports and pay the General Council portion of their tithes in the regular manner. Senior-retired ministers shall file an abbreviated report to maintain a correct address file for mail and insurance purposes.
- (2) Sources of income. These designations and guidelines shall apply regardless of whether the senior minister's income is from ministry, from retirement plans or Social Security payments, or from investments or other employment.
- (3) Designation in publications. No distinguishing mark shall accompany the listing of senior-active in the official publications of the Assemblies of God, but may be so indicated in the working lists used for insurance and retirement purposes. Senior-semiretired and senior-retired ministers shall have this status indicated in the Official List of Assemblies of God Ministers.
- (4) Support of General Council National Leadership and Resource Center.
