# ARTICLE XXI. AMENDMENTS (Page 81)

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any regular meeting of The General Council of the Assemblies of God. Amendments to be adopted shall require a majority of all votes cast.

# COMMISSION ON DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES ORDAINED MEMBERS

1	WHEREAS,	Members appointed to the Commission on Doctrines and Practices have
2		traditionally been ordained with the Assemblies of God even though the
3		General Council Constitution and Bylaws does not state that as a
4		requirement; and
5	WHEREAS,	It is beneficial for a variety of reasons to clarify and require that members
6		appointed to the Commission on Doctrines and Practices be credentialed
7		with the Assemblies of God; and
8	WHEREAS,	additional auditors have been appointed from time to time to assist the
9		Commission on Doctrines and Practices as needed and this continues to
10		be an option; therefore be it
11	RESOLVED,	That General Council Bylaws ARTICLE IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
12		DISAPPROVED, A. Commission on Doctrines and Practices, paragraph b.
13		Appointments and terms of office, page 57, which reads:
14		b. Appointments and terms of office. The commission shall be
15		appointed by the Executive Presbytery and shall consist of ten (10)
16		members representing, insofar as possible, the area divisions of the
17		Assemblies of God. Members shall be recognized authorities in
18		biblical knowledge. Their terms of office shall be for four (4) years.
19		Be amended to read:
20		b. Appointments and terms of office. The commission shall be
21		appointed by the Executive Presbytery and shall consist of ten (10)
22		members representing, insofar as possible, the area divisions of the
23		Assemblies of God. Members shall be ordained ministers with the
24		Assemblies of God and recognized authorities in biblical knowledge.
25		Their terms of office shall be for four (4) years.

# GENERAL PRESBYTERY DISTRICT AUDITOR

I	WHEREAS,	The requirement that a district's auditor to the General Presbytery be a "full-time
2		executive presbyter or officer" is difficult to follow; and
3	WHEREAS,	This requirement is unable to be verified by the national office when the request
4		is submitted; and
5	WHEREAS,	This requirement is unfair to districts whose officers are bi-vocational; and
6	WHEREAS,	This requirement seems irrelevant to today's culture in which most leaders are
7		filling multiple roles, some in the district office and some in other district
8		ministries; and
9	WHEREAS,	Some might narrowly define "full-time" as a 40-hour work week, while many in
10		ministry serve multiple positions or a combination and variety of roles; and
11	WHEREAS,	It is uncommon for any district to have a full-time district executive presbyter;
12		therefore, be it
13	RESOLVED,	That General Council Bylaws ARTICLE II. ELECTIONS OF OFFICERS AND
14		PRESBYTERS, Section 2. Nominations and Elections, paragraph d. General
15		presbyters, subparagraph (8), Auditors, (c) page 28, which reads:
16		(c) A district may select no more than one auditor for all duly
17		called sessions of the General Presbytery. Any auditor selected by
18		a district shall be one of its full-time executive presbyters or officers.
19		Expenses for the district auditors shall not be the responsibility of
20		the General Council.

22		(c) A district may select no more than one auditor for all duly
23		called sessions of the General Presbytery. Any auditor selected by
24		a district shall be one of its full-time executive presbyters or officers.

12	WHEREAS, Renaming the paragraph "Universalism" clearly states what is in	error;

1	WHEREAS, The General Council Bylaws Article IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
2	DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
3	DISAPPROVED, Section 3. Eschatological Errors, paragraph c., page 58
4	was written in light of only one eschatological error, namely post-tribulation
5	rapture, which denies the imminent return of Christ; and
6	WHEREAS, The primary reason for paragraph c was to preserve the teaching of Christ's
7	imminent return to gather the resurrected Church; and
8	WHEREAS, There are other teachings which also deny Christ's imminent return; and
9	WHEREAS, Naming as an error any teaching, whether or not it revolves around the
10	Tribulation, which denies Christ's imminent return will strengthen the reason
11	for paragraph c; therefore be it
12	RESOLVED, That the General Council Bylaws Article IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
13	DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
14	DISAPPROVED, Section 3. Eschatological Errors, paragraph c., page 58
15	which reads:
16	c. Post-Tribulation Rapture. The General Council of the
17	Assemblies of God has declared itself in the Statement of
18	Fundamental Truths that it holds to the belief in the imminent coming
19	of the Lord as the blessed hope of the Church; and since the teaching

7	WHEREAS,	The primary reason for paragraph d was to preserve the premillennial
8		teaching of Christ's bodily return and subsequent reign; and
9	WHEREAS,	There are other teachings which also deny the bodily return and subsequent
10		reign of Christ; and
11	WHEREAS,	Naming as an error any teaching which denies Christ's reign on earth
12		following His bodily return will strengthen the reason for paragraph d;
13		therefore be it
14	RESOLVED,	That the General Council Bylaws Article IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
15		DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
16		DISAPPROVED, Section 3. Eschatological Errors, paragraph d., page 58,

1	WHEREAS, The General Council Bylaws Article IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
2	DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
3	DISAPPROVED, Section 3. Eschatological Errors, paragraph e, page 58,
4	recommends that ministers refrain from preaching or teaching any of the
5	foregoing eschatological errors at the risk of their standing in the Fellowship;
6	and
7	WHEREAS, Explaining the errors may be necessary in explaining or defending the truths
8	which those errors deny; and
9	WHEREAS, Some may take "preaching or teaching" to mean any in-depth discussion of
10	said eschatological errors regardless of intent; and
11	WHEREAS, Teachers and preachers within the Fellowship should be encouraged to
12	freely discuss eschatological views in passing on the faith; and
13	WHEREAS, The intent of paragraph e is to prohibit the teaching or preaching of those
14	errors in order to lead others to believe them; therefore be it
15	RESOLVED, That the General Council Bylaws Article IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
16	DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
17	DISAPPROVED, Section 3. Eschatological Errors, paragraph e, page 58,
18	which reads:
19	e. Credentials jeopardized if made an issue. We
20	recommend that those ministers who embrace any of the foregoing
21	eschatological errors refrain from preaching or teaching them. Should
22	they persist in emphasizing these doctrines to the point of making
23	them an issue, their standing in the Fellowship will be seriously

# ALIGNING DIVORCE PROVISIONS THROUGHOUT THE BYLAWS

1	WHEREAS,	For ministerial credentialing purposes, The General Council will recognize
2		a divorce when the former spouse is still living in one of the following
3		circumstances as supported by Scripture: (1) the divorce occurred prior to
4		the applicant's conversion; (2) the former spouse's infidelity; (3)
5		abandonment of the believer by the unbeliever; (4) domestic violence by a
6		spouse to the applicant or child; or (5) ecclesiastical annulment; and
7	WHEREAS,	Portions of The General Council Bylaws have not been updated to align
8		with the above named positions; and
9	WHEREAS,	This incongruity seems to hold parishioners and church board members to
10		a different standard than credentialed ministers with regard to remarriage;
11		and
12	WHEREAS,	The provision for recognition of a divorce for a credential applicant or
13		spouse is supported by Scripture and should also apply to congregants and
14		lay people; therefore, be it
15	RESOLVED	, That General Council Bylaws ARTICLE IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
16		DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES
17		DISAPPROVED, Section 5. Divorce and Remarriage, paragraph b.
18		Remarriage, page 59, which reads:
19		b. Remarriage. Low standards on marriage and divorce are very
20		hurtful to individuals, to the family, and to the cause of Christ. Therefore,
21		we discourage divorce by all lawful means and teaching. We positively
22		disapprove of Christians getting divorces for any cause except
23		fornication and adultery (Matthew 19:9). Where these exceptional
24		circumstances exist or when a Christian has been divorced by an
25		unbeliever, we recommend that the question of remarriage be resolved
26		by the believer in the light of God's Word (1 Corinthians 7:15, 27–28).
27		Be amended to read:
28		b. Remarriage. Low standards on marriage and divorce are very
29		hurtful to individuals, to the family, and to the cause of Christ. Therefore,
30		we discourage divorce by all lawful means and teaching. We positively

disapprove of Christians getting divorces for any cause except fornication and adultery (Matthew 19:9), or the abandonment of the believer by the unbeliever (1 Corinthians 7:10–15), or in the case of domestic violence by a spouse to a spouse or child (Matthew 18:6; Ephesians 5:28-33; Colossians 3:19), or an annulment (Proverbs 12:22; Matthew 19:6; 1 Corinthians 7:5). Where these exceptional circumstances exist or when a Christian has been divorced by an unbeliever, we recommend that the question of remarriage be resolved by the believer in the light of God's Word (Matthew 19:3-12; 1 Corinthians 7:10-28 15, 27–28).

#### And, be it therefore further

RESOLVED, That The General Council Bylaws Article IX. DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES DISAPPROVED, B. LIST OF DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES DISAPPROVED, Section 5 Divorce and Remarriage, paragraph e. Ministerial credentials, page 60 which reads:

e. Ministerial credentials. We disapprove of any married minister of the Assemblies of God holding credentials if either minister or spouse has a former spouse living unless the divorce occurred prior to conversion (2 Corinthians 5:17) or for the scriptural causes of a former spouse's marital unfaithfulness (Matthew 19:9) or the abandonment of the believer by the unbeliever (1 Corinthians 7:10–15) or in the case of domestic violence by a spouse to a spouse or child (Psalms 11:5; 146:5–9; Proverbs 6:16; Isaiah 1:16–17; Ephesians 4:1–3, 31–32; Ephesians 5). (See also Bylaws, Article VII, Section 2, paragraphs j and k.)

#### Be amended to read:

e. Ministerial credentials. We disapprove of any married minister of the Assemblies of God holding credentials if either minister or spouse has a former spouse living unless the divorce occurred prior to conversion (2 Corinthians 5:17), or for the scriptural causes of a former spouse's marital unfaithfulness (Matthew 19:9) or the abandonment of the believer by the unbeliever, (1 Corinthians 7:10–15) or in the case of domestic violence by a spouse to a spouse or child (Psalms 11:5; 146:5–

1	9; Proverbs 6:16; Isaiah 1:16–17; Ephesians 4:1–3, 31–32; Ephesians 5),
2	or an ecclesiastical annulment (Proverbs 12:22; Matthew 19:6; 1
3	Corinthians 7:5). (See also Bylaws, Article VII, Section 2, paragraphs j and
4	k.)

# SUBSEQUENT DISMISSAL CLARIFIED

WHEREAS, The provision for a subsequent dismissal is provided for and sought when a

2	minister's previous credential status was either resigned, lapsed, or not
3	renewed; and
4	WHEREAS, The wording in The General Council Bylaws does not specifically name the
5	"not renewed" status to be included although it is implied; and
6	WHEREAS, Legal counsel for The General Council has advised that it would be prudent
7	to revise the wording to match the intention and practice of the provision to
8	specifically include the "not renewed" option; therefore be it
9	RESOLVED, That the General Council Bylaws ARTICLE X. DISCIPLINE, Section 9.
10	Referral for Action to the General Council Credentials Committee,
11	paragraph a. District recommendation, subparagraph (3), page 69 which
12	reads:
13	(3) Subsequent dismissal. Should evidence come to light following a
14	minister's resignation, or the lapse of his or her credentials, of conduct
15	occurring prior to his or her resignation or lapse of credentials that would
16	constitute grounds for disciplinary action under Article X, Section 3, of
17	these Bylaws, the district at its discretion may request the General Council
18	Credentials Committee to change that minister's status from lapsed or
19	resigned to dismissed. The district shall inform the minister involved of its
20	action and, where applicable, the superintendent of the minister's district of
21	affiliation. All rights of appeal will apply.
22	Be amended to read:
23	(3) Subsequent dismissal. Should evidence come to light, following a
24	minister's resignation, or the lapse of his or her termination of credentials,
25	(whether by lapse, resignation, or not renewed), of conduct occurring prior to
26	said change of credential status his or her resignation or lapse of credentials
27	that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action under Article X,
28	Section 3, of these Bylaws, the district at its discretion may request the
29	General Council Credentials Committee to change that minister's credential

status from lapsed or resigned to dismissed. The district shall inform the former minister involved of its action and, where applicable, the superintendent of the minister's district of affiliation. All rights of appeal will apply.

# **COMMISSION ON CHAPLAINS**

1	WHEREAS, Prior to 1973, Chaplaincy was in two separate departments in the
2	National Office; and
3	WHEREAS, In 1973, the two Chaplaincy ministries were joined together into one
4	department under U.S. Missions, but continued to function under two
5	different cost centers for recordkeeping; and
6	WHEREAS, The Commission on Chaplains voted to unify the department in
7	November 2019; and
8	WHEREAS, The General Council Bylaws needs to be refreshed in order to align
9	with current practice; therefore be it
10	RESOLVED, That the General Council Bylaws Article XIV. ASSEMBLIES OF GOD
11	U.S. MISSIONS, Section 2. Organization and Governance,
12	paragraph g, pages 77–78, which reads:
13	g. Commission on Chaplains
14	(1) Composition. The Commission on Chaplains shall consist
15	of the executive director of Assemblies of God U.S. Missions,
16	representatives of the Military/Veterans Affairs and Institutional/
17	Occupational Chaplaincies, one of whom shall be the
18	department director of Chaplaincy Ministries, two executive
19	presbyters, two Military/Veterans Affairs chaplains, two
20	Institutional/Occupational chaplains, two members at large, legal
21	counsel, and others at the discretion of the Executive Leadership
22	Team. The commission shall serve as the endorsing agency for The
23	General Council of the Assemblies of God. Members of the
24	commission and its chairperson shall be appointed by the Executive
25	Presbytery.
26	(2) Authority and amenability. The government and work
27	of Chaplaincy Ministries shall be vested in and committed to the
28	Commission on Chaplains. The commission shall operate within
29	guidelines adopted by the Executive Presbytery. It shall have the
30	responsibility to evaluate policies, to offer guidance and counsel in

the area of its supervision, to establish criteria for the appointment of workers in the Military/Veterans Affairs, Institutional/Occupational Chaplaincies, and to sit as a Board of Appeal in all matters relating to its area of supervision. It shall be amenable to and under the general supervision of the Executive Presbytery and the General Presbytery.

#### Be amended to read:

#### g. Commission on Chaplains

(1) Composition. The Commission on Chaplains shall consist of the executive director of Assemblies of God U.S. Missions, the national representatives of the Military/Veterans Affairs and Institutional/ Occupational Chaplaincies, the Chaplaincy Department, one of whom shall be the department senior director of Chaplaincy Ministries, two executive presbyters, two Military/ Veterans Affairs chaplains, two Institutional/Occupational chaplains, four chaplains from the various areas of Chaplaincy Ministries, two members at large, legal counsel, and others at the discretion of the Executive Leadership Team, to include representatives from the Military, Health Care and Correctional ministries. The commission shall serve as the endorsing agency for The General Council of the Assemblies of God. Members of the commission and its chairperson shall be appointed by the Executive Presbytery.

(2) Authority and amenability. The government and work of Chaplaincy Ministries shall be vested in and committed to the Commission on Chaplains. The commission shall operate within guidelines adopted by the Executive Presbytery. It shall have the responsibility to evaluate policies, to offer guidance and counsel in the area of its supervision, to establish criteria for the appointment of workers in the Military/Veterans Affairs, Institutional/Occupational Chaplaincies, Chaplaincy Ministries, and to sit as a Board of Appeal in all matters relating to its area of supervision. It shall be amenable to and under the general supervision of the Executive Presbytery

and the General Presbytery.
